that would afford me more real

pleasure but it is impossible to
leave home but we intend to come
next month and stay several days.
Emmies eyes are not much better
can not see but very little. Mother
health is very good for a woman
of her age. Cousin Ben's wife is
quite sick has some thing like
Measles. all the rest of the relatives
are well. There has been a great
many deaths here and they are
marking about one week around me.
tell Cousin James he must not
marry until I come for I am a
fraid he will not give me that
Pig and we have not got one to send you Cousin.
Get the Glad. Mr Stout baby
did one week ago it was one of
the greatest sufferers I ever saw.
the weather has been far more
than a week like May there is a
great deal of fear of the meat-

spoiling. I am sorry that your Ma
is not much better. Well I guess
children are all looking forward
to Christmas with a happy heart
and expect a great many nice presents
I will say Christmas gift to all
of you for I expect you will
get this letter that day. there is
a great many young people have
come to this neighborhood last
week to spend a week or two days.
give my love to all and a kiss
to the Little Girl. I want you to
write and tell me all the news and
